Half Term Curriculum Overview

F2 – Spring 1 – People Who Help Us

Literacy

Word Reading:

In our phonics we will continue to learn new letters and sounds through our Sounds Write Phonics Lessons. We will develop our confidence in reading simple words and sentences. We will learn Unit 7, 8, 9 and 10 sounds as well as some new sight words – these are words that we can't sound out e.g., come, some, to.

Writing:

This half term we will continue to use our phonics knowledge in our writing. We will move from simple CVC words, to writing captions and simple sentences such as 'The cup is full.'. We will use the phrase 'say the sounds, write the word' to help us. We will be practicing our letter formation through a range of fun activities. A big focus will be on building our confidence with writing.

Comprehension:

As we get to know each of our focus texts we will develop our literacy skills. Including sequencing the story, drawing story maps and retelling the story in our own words. We will have new vocabulary each week based on our focus text.

Maths

Number

In number this half term, we will spend time focusing on numbers 0-5. We will develop our subitising skills, to see how many of something there are, without counting. We will spend time learning about 1 more and 1 less. Towards the end of the half-term we will move onto numbers 6,7,8. Spending time looking at their composition and different ways to represent them.

Numerical Patterns

During the half term, we will look at making pairs with objects and using this to support our developing understanding of odd's and even's. We will develop our understanding of shape, space and measure by looking at mass and capacity. Here we will compare the mass of objects.

Understanding the World

People, culture and communities

We will be learning about the community through our topic 'People Who Help Us'. We will spend time exploring different professions, who helps us when and the value that each person brings to a community.

The Natural World

We will continue to spend lots of time outside, exploring the natural resources around us and observing the changes in weather and seasons. We will make observations of the natural world on our walks to the care home.

Past and present

We will be exploring past and present in everyday conversations, talking about what happened yesterday, last week, what is happening now and what is going to happen. We will look further into the past while exploring 'nurses' and find out about our namesake – Florence Nightingale!

Physical Development

Gross and fine motor skills

In PE we will continue to explore moving in different ways and begin to look at dancing. We will be exploring different beats and moving our bodies in time with a beat. We will learn a dance routine and create our own dance routine. In Commando Joe, we will be using our strength and coordination to complete team build activities.

Daily, children will take part in fine motor activities to develop their strength and control. This will support their writing development.

Expressive Arts and Design

Creating with materials

We will continue exploring materials in continuous provision. Looking at how we can combine, mix and build with them. We will have the opportunity to create 'People Who Help Us' crafts including superhero masks, capes, building emergency vehicles and so much more!

Being Imaginative

Everyday we have the opportunity for child-led play, where creativity and imagination is at the heart of what we do. Children will have the opportunity to role play in our home corner and shop, dress up, make stories, sing and dance and so on. We will continue to celebrate our individuality and our unique thoughts and ideas.

This half term we will be focusing on developing individual liberty, building selfconfidence in our learning and social interactions.
